Dear Greenebucs Friends,

This year Greenebucs joined other members of AMBUCS to celebrate the 100th anniversary of its beginning. Founded in Birmingham its mission was to improve independence in the lives of people with disabilities. That mission remains the same today. Greenebucs joined this endeavor in 1991 and is asking you to support us in continuance of that quest.

Despite shortages of these trykes due to COVID and supply chain issues, Greenebucs has been busy. Working with therapists who continued to request trykes we have continued to order them. Some designs were still available through warehouse stock. Some others were donated back to us (rider outgrew the tryke, or better still outgrew the need), then refurbished and "spruced up" and donated to a waiting family. We have been notified that within the next six months all backorders will be fulfilled. Greenebucs has more than 100 trykes on back order for riders who are waiting patiently (or impatiently) for them.

In addition to providing trykes to children and veterans we support other non-profits whose mission parallels ours – improving the quality of life for those with disabilities. Food is provided indirectly throughout the year by donating to Feed The Creek and directly at Thanksgiving and Christmas. We also purchase gifts for families at Christmas so families unable to do so will not be denied this joy.

Included with this letter are potential opportunities for donations to help us reach these goals – to pay for all the trykes on back order so we may continue to donate these to families who have been waiting, and to continue to build ramps and provide necessities for families already burdened with medical bills and other expenses related to having a family member with a lifelong disability.

Greenebucs knows that at this time of the year you receive many requests for support. We appreciate your willingness to consider supporting us. November 29th is Giving Tuesday. We invite you to consider making a donation to Greenebucs.org this day or by sending a check to Greenebucs, P.O. Box 1, Alpha, OH 45301. If you have supported us in the past, we thank you. If you can support us this year we thank you. If you are unable to support us this year we understand and thank you for taking the time to read this letter. We hope too that you will consider supporting us in the future.

Forget deck the halls! We've decked the park with dazzling lights! You'll wind your way through our Winter Wonderland, North Pole Car Show, Winter Farm, and Festive Festival, then wave to Santa at the North Pole. Drive through once, and you'll want to do it again.

Easy overnight pecan sticky buns.



Ingredients 24 frozen Parker House rolls 1 cup chopped pecans 3.5 ounce butterscotch pudding mix (not instant) 1/2 cup butter 1 cup light brown sugar packed 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon Instructions The night before: Generously butter a 9×13 pan or baking dish and spread the chopped nuts over the bottom. Space 24 frozen rolls evenly on top of nuts Sprinkle evenly with the dry pudding mix. In a medium-size bowl, melt the butter, brown sugar, and cinnamon in the microwave. Start with one minute and stir. Then continue in 30-second increments, stirring after each, until the mixture is melted. Stir the melted butter, sugar, and cinnamon until well blended. Drizzle the melted mixture evenly over the top of the rolls. Cover loosely with waxed paper (or non-stick foil) and place in cold oven overnight. The next morning: Remove waxed paper (or foil) and discard. Place the pan back in the cold oven and turn on to 350 F. Bake for about 20 minutes. Remove the pan from the oven. Allow the buns to cool briefly (about 8-10 minutes) and then invert them onto a serving plate or board. Cut or pull apart the individual rolls.
