# Colonial Williamsburg Gingerbread Cookies

### Ingredients:

- 1 cup sugar
- 4 cups of unbleached flour
- 2 teaspoons ginger
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/2 teaspoon salt (or use salted butter)
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 cup butter, melted
- 1/2 cup evaporated milk
- 1 cup unsulfured molasses
- a dash of vanilla extract
- a dash of lemon extract

#### **Directions:**

- Combine the sugar, ginger, nutmeg, cinnamon, baking soda and salt in a bowl. Mix well.
- 2. Add the melted butter, evaporated milk, molasses and extracts. Mix well.
- 3. Add the flour 1 cup at a time, stirring all the while.
- 4. The dough will be stiff and hard to mix which is normal for gingerbread. If you find that it is too sticky to roll out add up to 1/2 cup of additional flour.
- 5. Roll out on a floured sugar until it is 1/4 inch thick. Cut out or cut and stamp.
- 6. Bake in greased cookie sheets in a preheated oven. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes.
- 7. Allow to cool and set for at least 5 minutes before handling.




## Your Holiday Reading List
